## ITINERARY SUMMARY

Overnight at City Lodge or Intercontinental hotel, OR Tambo, Johannesburg, depending on your package.

Day 1: Early Check in. Fly from OR Tambo to St Helena Island with Airlink, with a fuel stop at Walvis Bay, Namibia Arrive St Helena.

Transfer to the Mantis St Helena hotel, Jamestown Guided walk to Mundens Point overlooking James' Bay Welcome dinner.

Day 2: Full day Island Tour that traverses the entire island taking in Sea View and Gordon's Post to Deadwood Plain, Longwood, the Millennium Forest, Levelwood, Sandy Bay, Blue Hill, St Paul's and Ladder Hill. With afternoon tea.

Day 3: A morning Marine Safari along the leeward side of the island and see rich sealife, very likely the local superpod of pan tropical dolphins, military fortifications, geological formations, seabirds, and an opportunity to take a swim or snorkel.

Visit the St Helena Museum followed by a guided Historic Town Walk in the afternoon.

Day 4: Visit Plantation House, the home of the island's Governors and the world's oldest living land animal, Jonathan the Tortoise.

Picnic Lunch, followed by a scenic hike to the West of the Island.



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Day 5: Choose from pre-booked activities including exploring and making local handicrafts, scuba diving, hiking, e-biking, golf (on the worlds' most remote golf course), snorkeling and more. Or a day at leisure. An evening fish braai and sundowners at the St Helena Yacht Club.

Day 6: In the morning, explore the legacies of Anglo Boer War, Zulus, African Slaves, East India Company and Chinese on St Helena.

After lunch, enjoy a bean-to-cup coffee tour (St Helena has some of the most sought after coffee on the planet).

Day 7: Visit the three main Napoleonic sites: he Briars Pavillion, the French Emperor's long term residence Longwood House, and his Tomb.

Lunch at the former house of Napoleon's General Henry Bertrand.
